The Counter Reformation

Because the Protestant Reformation was becoming so popular in Europe, the Roman Catholic Church decided to reform (change) itself. The Pope ordered a group of Bishops to Trent, Italy, in 1545. This group, known as the **Council of Trent**, met for 18 years, 1545-1563. The Council of Trent agreed to the following:

- 1. The Pope was God's representative on Earth.
- 2. Only the Catholic Church could explain the Bible.
- 3. The sale of indulgences was wrong and they had to end.
- 4. The Catholic Church should make a catalog of books people were forbidden to read.
- 5. A new army of missionaries should be made. They were called <u>Jesuits</u>, or the <u>Society of Jesus</u>. The Jesuits were like soldiers. They fought for the Roman Catholic Church and against Protestantism all over the world. Jesuit missionaries taught in Poland, England, China, India, and in the new world.
- 6. The Holy Roman Catholic Courts, known as the *Inquisition*, should punish people who opposed the Catholic religion.

Many religious wars took place between Roman Catholics and Protestants all over Europe during the 16th (1700s) and the 17th (1800s) centuries. When they finally ended, two major Christian religions existed: Roman Catholicism and Protestantism.
